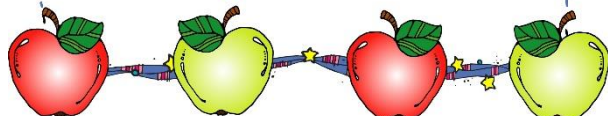




TUITION

We at Wesley love teaching the children and watching them grow and blossom into wonderful little people. But, you can be a good teacher for your child too!! Everyday experiences are great opportunities for learning. You can teach about shapes by cutting cheese into triangles and squares; or about textures as you play outside and feel the grass, rocks, and if you can stand it; dirt & mud. You don't need to buy expensive toys. Often what children like best are household items such as pots and pans, wooden spoons, and plastic containers.

Children also learn about making friends and getting along with others as you take a walk and talk with neighbors. They learn self control when they have to wait their turn to go down the slide at the playground. You matter. What you do makes a difference. You teach your child self control when you remain calm in stressful situations, such as being stuck in traffic. Your child learns about responsibility when you pick up litter you see on the playground. You model helping others when together you take care of the neighbors pets. Children learn manners and respect for others when they see you thank the grocery store clerk. They learn trust when you keep your word.

Your beliefs and values shape what you teach your child. Ultimately, what you teach your child reflects the values that are most important to your family.

Being aware of your values and how they influence your parenting will help you make good choices as your child grows.

We will continue to teach your children. We will let them explore, touch, feel, and problem solve, but they can learn so much from you. Remember, you are their best teachers!

SECURITY SYSTEM FOR WESLEY

As you know, we have a FOB system that helps us keep unscheduled visitors from entering the building unannounced. Please make sure that you have your FOB with you so you can gain access to the building as the office staff may be tied up on the phone or with students or parents. If you need an extra FOB, please let us know and we'd be happy to program one for you. There is a \$10.00 deposit for each FOB that you require, which is returned to you when the FOB is handed in. CONFERENCES:

In April, we will be holding Parent-Teacher Conferences. You will receive your time slot very soon. The following is a list of suggested questions that you could use during your 15 minute conference time. You will also receive a Progress Report before your scheduled conference. Take the time to review it and high light any questions or concerns you might have. Remember, the Progress Report is a snapshot of how we see your child in school.

- Does my child seem happy?
- Is he / she a leader or a follower?
- How well do they transition from one activity to another.
- Does my child respond when spoken to by the teacher? By the other students?
- Does my child participate in circle time, with other children during free playtime, in the general program?
- Do you (as the teacher) have any concerns about he / she moving to the next level? (ie: 4 year old program to Kindergarten)
- Is there anything we need to work on at home?
- How does my child deal with conflict?
- Have you seen growth in my child? In what areas?
- How is my child's communication skills?

Conferences can be stressful, but by now I am sure that you are comfortable with your child's teachers and the program to get the most out of this valuable time. Just do a little preparation before your appointment and everything will be great.
